# Mission Platform Portal: over 4 000 users, 200 cities and 170 groups





Climate Transition Map – an interactive guide to the different phases and steps of the journey to climate neutrality, linking to corresponding resources



**Knowledge Repository** – includes 700+ curated entries grouped under 40 tags allowing users to scout innovation and explore new opportunities



**City Dossiers** – a detailed dataset on the city's vision, GHG emissions, investment needs, capacity building priorities, stakeholders, collaborations, skills and barriers



**Finance Guidance Tool** – based on a questionnaire that helps cities define their financing needs and filter the types of funding that are appropriate

#### **PILOT CITIES PROGRAMME link**





PILOT CITIES test and implement innovative approaches to rapid decarbonisation over a two-year period

1<sup>st</sup> cohort, 2022 call: <u>25 pilots</u>, 53 cities from 21 countries 2<sup>nd</sup> cohort, 2023 call: <u>22 pilots</u>, 26 cities from 16 countries 3<sup>rd</sup> cohort, 2024 call: <u>21 pilots</u>, 25 cities from 12 countries

#### TWINNING LEARNING PROGRAMME <u>link</u>



TWIN CITIES are paired with pilot cities based on shared interests for onsite visits and expert advice over 18 months

1<sup>st</sup> cohort: 40 twin cities from 20 countries

2<sup>nd</sup> cohort: <u>call closed</u> on 7 June 2024

3<sup>rd</sup> cohort: call to open in September 2024

# A new group of 20 cities receives EU Mission Label for their efforts towards climate neutrality

Today, the <u>EU Mission Label</u> was awarded to 20 cities that are part of the EU Mission for Climate-Neutral and Smart Cities, one of the EU Missions under Horizon Europe, the EU's research and innovation programme.

The Label recognises the cities' plans to achieve climate neutrality by 2030 and aims to facilitate access to public and private funding towards that objective. This brings the total number of cities with the label to 53.

Iliana Ivanova, Commissioner for Innovation, Research, Culture, Education and Youth, said:

"The EU Mission Label celebrates the bold steps these 20 cities are taking towards climate neutrality. Their commitment paves the way for a sustainable and resilient future for all our communities. The Commission will continue supporting them on this journey."

The 20 cities that received the label today are: Aachen, Münster (Germany), Trikala (Greece), Miskolc (Hungary), Eilat (Israel), Bologna, Bergamo, Milan, Prato, Turin (Italy), Liepāja (Latvia), The Hague (the Netherlands), Porto (Portugal), Bucharest 2nd District, Suceava (Romania), Ljubljana, Kranj (Slovenia), Gothenburg, Gävle, Umeå (Sweden).





## **Examples of synergies with other EU programmes**

- **Connecting Europe Facility**: All relevant calls that opened in September 2022 for projects on the TEN-T network (in total more than EUR 5 billion) include participation in the Cities Mission as an award criterion under "priority and urgency"; to be carried on in future calls. So far, EUR 75 million have benefited Mission cities.
- **LIFE Strategic Integrated Projects Climate Action**: Urban or community-based action plans pioneering the transition to climate neutral and/or climate resilient society, including climate-neutral cities plans and actions, for instance in the context of the EU Mission 'Climate-neutral and smart cities' and Sustainable Urban Mobility Plans (EUR 30 million).
- **Urban Innovative Action**: References to the Cities Mission and the Adaptation Mission in call topics "greener cities" (overall budget EUR 120 million) and "energy transition" (overall budget EUR 90 million)
- **Regional Operational Programmes:** References to the Cities Mission in some national and regional programmes, joint meetings with national and regional managing authorities




## Help with access to funding and finance
